Brothers Redevelopment's 45th annual Paint-A-Thon had a tremendously successful 2023.

Thanks to the help of 2,621 volunteers who collectively spent 19,454 hours volunteering, the Paint-A-Thon painted 116 homes last year. The program served lowincome, older adults in 19 cities including: Denver, Commerce City, Brighton, Colorado Springs, Thornton, Littleton, Lakewood, Englewood, Aurora, and other parts of the state.

As we continue our legacy of making a meaningful impact on the lives of those in need, we recognize the evolving housing challenges facing our region. Year after year, thousands turn to Brothers Redevelopment for support, especially our elderly and disabled clients navigating fixed or limited incomes, struggling to afford essential home improvements and preservation services.

The pressing issue of limited availability and high costs associated with market-rate contractors has intensified, putting more seniors and low-income families at risk of homelessness or residing in unsafe living conditions.

Enter our Paint-A-Thon Program, a time-tested initiative with established partnerships in both private and public sectors. Through sponsorships, charitable contributions, and dedicated volunteers, the program annually serves over 100 Coloradans. Over its 46-year history, the Paint-A-Thon has transformed the homes of 7,845 seniors, disabled, and low-income clients, thanks to the support of more than 155,000 volunteers. This remarkable impact is a testament to the strength of our community partnerships.

The average Paint-A-Thon project value is \$6,127 - a price that would've cost Paint-A-Thon clients 25% of their average household income had they paid for their home to be painted.

In 2023, the average Paint-A-Thon recipient's annual income was \$24,027 a year - a number that is drastically lower than Colorado's median household income average of \$75,231, according to the U.S. Census Bureau. So many community members need a few home protection items in order to stay in their home – which statistically helps them be safer, healthier, lower incidence of depression, lower overall medical costs and live longer. Painting is a home preservation and protection requirement that is impossible for our clients to do physically or financially.

Here's What Happened in 2023



With the assistance of 2,621 dedicated volunteers, we successfully painted 116 homes. This marked a notable increase of over 600 individuals in the number of volunteers compared to the previous year.

The average 2023 Paint-A-Thon client was 75 years old and has lived in their home for 29 years. More than half of our 2023 older adults live alone.





Volunteers collectively contributed 19,454 hours in total across all projects in 2023. The value of the work provided by volunteers to homeowners is estimated at \$618,637.
