How does BRI change lives?



Brothers Redevelopment, Inc. (BRI) is a 501(c)3 nonprofit providing a range of housing solutions for low-income households, older adults, and people living with disabilities across Colorado. **Home is at the center of everything we do, and we believe it is a basic human right to have a safe, decent place to live.**

In Colorado, around 50% of renters and over 20% of homeowners are spending more than 30% of their income on housing, forcing low- to moderate-income households to choose between basic needs like housing, food, and medical care.* Every day, BRI employs a holistic approach to eliminating the barriers to stable housing for the communities we serve.

We work at the intersection between health and housing - building housing stability to maximize health and mental health outcomes for our clients.

Before severe arthritis limited her mobility, 86-year-old Gloria Loggins lived an active life in Colorado Springs and worked more than 20 years as a dental therapist at Fort Carson. As her health declined, stairs and bathing became daily challenges, and her children worried constantly about her safety.

Through Brothers Redevelopment, Loggins received life-changing updates – a garage ramp, new railings, a stair lift, and a modified bathroom with a sliding bath chair.

*“God knew in advance that I was going to need this help,” Loggins said. **“They were professional, kind, and treated me with respect.”** Now, Loggins moves safely through her home, and her daughter says the changes have improved her mother’s health and peace of mind.*
